


Places of deprivation of liberty: number, profile and geography during the war


2.1. Places of deprivation of liberty are the focus of monitoring

As in the “Preliminary Review”, the research focused on places of deprivation of liberty, namely:




penitentiary institutions: pretrial detention centers, correctional colonies, correctional centers;

social protection institutions for persons with disabilities and the elderly: geriatric institutions (nursing homes for the elderly and persons with disabilities, boarding houses for war and labor veterans, inpatient departments for



permanent or temporary residence, centers for the provision of social services centers/territorial centers of social service); psychoneurological boarding institutions and orphanages (for children and persons under the age of 35);



psychiatric care facilities, including special ones (health care facilities for inpatient psychiatric care).

The research deals with several categories of Ukrainian citizens who, being in places of deprivation of liberty, cannot independently and freely make decisions about personal safety and integrity, as well as about evacuation to a safe place in the event that there is a threat of hostilities in the place where they live permanently.

In particular, it is about:

- persons detained and serving sentences in prisons (mostly adult women and men);
- adults with disabilities and elderly people who are in places of detention and need round-the-clock care. Such persons may be deprived of legal capacity or recognized as having limited legal capacity and cannot independently make an informed decision about the need to evacuate and leave dangerous areas. Some of them are unable to move independently or are palliative patients; many also have no relatives or have lost contact with them;
- patients of psychiatric care facility inpatient departments, among whom are persons forcibly hospitalized by court decision, as well as those who do not have their own housing and/or have lost family and social ties. Moreover, there are persons who, according to the court decision, are subject to coercive measures of a medical nature and the preventive measure of placement in a psychiatric care facility in conditions that exclude danger.

2.2. The number of places of deprivation of liberty and people in them, as of the beginning of 2022






As of January 01, 2022, the health care system had 54 psychiatric institutions, including inpatient care, and their total bed fund was 21266 beds.




2.3. The number of places of deprivation of liberty and people in them, as of the beginning of 2023*

According to the information provided by the National Social Service of Ukraine, as of January 01, 2023, the social protection system of the population operates:







2.4. Transfer of places of deprivation of liberty after February 24, 2022

According to information from the National Social Service of Ukraine, in the period from February 24, 2022 to the present day, out of 46 boarding institutions of the social protection system of the population of Donetsk, Dnipropetrovsk, Zhytomyr, Zaporizhzhia, Kyiv, Kirovohrad, Luhansk, Mykolaiv, Odesa, Rivne, Sumy, Kharkiv, Kherson, Khmelnytskyi regions and Kyiv – almost 6,000 people living in boarding facilities were evacuated to safe (including within the province) regions of Ukraine.

As of March 10, 2023 3500 people with disabilities and elderly temporarily transferred (evacuated) from boarding institutions in dangerous regions of Ukraine live in social protection institutions and psychiatric care facilities of other regions.

Also, more than 900 persons were evacuated outside Ukraine (the Republic of Poland, the Federal Republic of Germany, the Kingdom of Spain, the Republic of Italy, the Republic of Latvia), in particular 330 people with disabilities living in psychoneurological boarding institutions (adult persons), 600 – people staying in orphanages. The temporary transfer (evacuation) of people from institutions located in dangerous regions or under shelling continues.

As of January 01, 2023, there were 24 boarding institutions left in the territory not under the control of Ukraine (temporarily occupied in 2022), such as: 12 psychoneurological boarding institutions (Zaporizhzhia region – 3, Luhansk region – 4, Kherson region – 4); 10 nursing care homes for the elderly and persons with disabilities (Donetsk – 2, Zaporizhzhia region – 1, Luhansk region – 4, Kherson region – 3); 1 special nursing care home (Kherson region); 1 orphanage (Kherson region). The number of persons who currently live in these boarding institutions in the temporarily occupied territories of Ukraine are unknown.


As of March 31, 2023, detainees were evacuated from 11 penitentiaries.

In addition, there are 7 penitentiary institutions on the territory not controlled by Ukraine (temporarily occupied in 2022). The number of people currently held in penitentiary institutions in the temporarily occupied territories of Ukraine are unknown.

Separately, within the cabinet part of the monitoring, an analysis of the number of institutions in areas close to the area of active hostilities and the distances from them to the front line was carried out. The vast majority of them were never evacuated – the results are given in tables (Annexes O–P) and quarterly visualizations (Illustrations 1–4).


